Sudbury Takes Strong Action to Protect its Citizens

The City of Greater Sudbury has provided a Sewer Bypass Alert Notification, whereby you can register to receive email notification whenever there is a sewage bypass or wastewater overflow at any of their wastewater treatment facilities.

The Vermilion River Stewardship (VRS) lobbied for this real-time Alert to ensure those families relying on the receiving lakes and rivers for their household water and/or recreational activities are notified whenever a bypass occurs, and can take appropriate action.

You are encouraged to register <u>here</u> to receive Alerts when a sewage bypass or spill occurs. All bypass events will be posted at this location for a period of 7 days after the bypass has ended. Monthly bypass and overflow reports are also available on the Stewardship page.

A sewage bypass can occur when equipment malfunctions or, as is becoming more and more common, during extreme rain events when wastewater facilities can become overwhelmed from the extraneous inflow and infiltration of stormwater into the system.

Citizens must ensure their eve trough downspouts are not connected to the sewer system, as this is a major cause for the need to bypass wastewater, and these hook-ups are illegal. If extreme flows are not bypassed, sewers can back up into basements, and private property and wastewater infrastructure can be damaged.

"The VRS wishes to thank the City of Greater Sudbury, Jacques Barbeau, Michael Vagnini, and Sudbury Water/Wastewater staff for taking strong action to protect the health and safety of its citizens", said Linda Heron, Chair of the VRS.

The City of Greater Sudbury is only the second City in Ontario to take action on this important issue, and is working diligently to correct the inflow and infiltration challenges.

VRS is a Not-for-Profit grassroots organization with a mission to act as a voice for the Vermilion River and its watershed. VRS works to build partnerships and strategic alliances with all other interested parties, communities, stewardships, organizations and industry to ensure clean and healthy water quality, and a balanced and sustainable ecosystem and natural habitat
